



- Occurs in the semester of your math class
- For semester 1 math students: EQAO Snapshot Wednesday, November 26
 - All Grade 9 students in math P1-3 will start at 8:05
 - All Grade 9 students in math P4-5 will start at 12:05
 - We use the snapshot data to guide our instruction and provided intentional support

During MSIPs, students will participate in focused sessions that strengthen the math skills assessed on the EQAO snapshot. These sessions are designed to build confidence and reinforce concepts, providing students with meaningful practice leading up to the assessment. (Dates: Nov 21, Dec 8, & Jan 8 during MSIP)




Updates from Guidance:


