EQAO Results

- OSSLT 90% Success (same as last year)
 - Having two writings a year, allows WNSS to narrow the focus for those who many not be successful in the fall in order to write again in the Spring
 - 70-80% pass first time writing, then specialized supports for the rest
- Grade 9 Math- 60% achieved at L3/L4- 10% increase
 - One change this year is the test is now worth 10% of the students final grade 9 math grade
 - This has been communicated to parents and students by each teacher
 - Goal this year is 65% to achieve L3/L4
 - The approach is to identify students who are close to achieving the next level, and working with students in "bump-up" groups to help students go from level 2 to 3 for example

Current EQAO support/ status

- OSSLT- currently being written
 - Literacy focused MSIPs
 - After literacy results come in and those who are not successful are identified, school will ensure there is a literacy fluent teacher teaching a literacy focused MSIP to assist
 - Literacy practice embedded into all grade 9 courses
- Grade 9 Math- at semester's end
 - Math department will review the midterm snapshot to see what expectations need more attention and focus on before EQAO is written at the end of the semester. "Bump-up" groups available as well.
 - Snapshot available to parents?
 - Grade 9 math teachers connect throughout the year to ensure consistency amongst classes
