Wolfpack and Families,

I have a few information items for you below.

1) Beginning and End of Day Transportation

- a) The time around the morning and afternoon bells can be very busy. Please drive slowly, be patient, and stay calm safety is the most important thing.
- b) Picking up your child at 2:25pm or later is a great way to avoid the rush at the bell.
- c) School buses must be given the right of way, and priority, when entering or exiting the school driveways. They have a schedule to keep, and are doing their best to do that. Please treat them with kindness and respect. Hostile behaviour and dangerous driving will be reported to police.
- d) School buses leave at 2:20pm (wave 1) and 2:30pm (wave 2) they generally leave all at once please anticipate slowdowns at that time
- e) Observations from today are that things were working well thank you to all the drivers taking turns and exercising patience
- f) One other note please give buses space as they try to leave the parking lot both from the side and rear - they cannot proceed if vehicles are within the range of their tail swing

- b) The Junior game is at 3:00 pm, followed by the Seniors at 5:00 pm.
- c) There will be a gate fee for both games. Students can enter for \$3.00, adults for \$5.00 and children under 10 are admitted free of charge. To assist school staff with supervision, once you enter the gates, you must stay inside. Portable toilets and a concession stand will be inside the gates. If spectators leave, they will not be re-admitted.

Jason is a dynamic and engaging speaker and will support students make connections to the themes of the course which include identity, relationship, and self- determination, sovereignty, or self-governance.
